

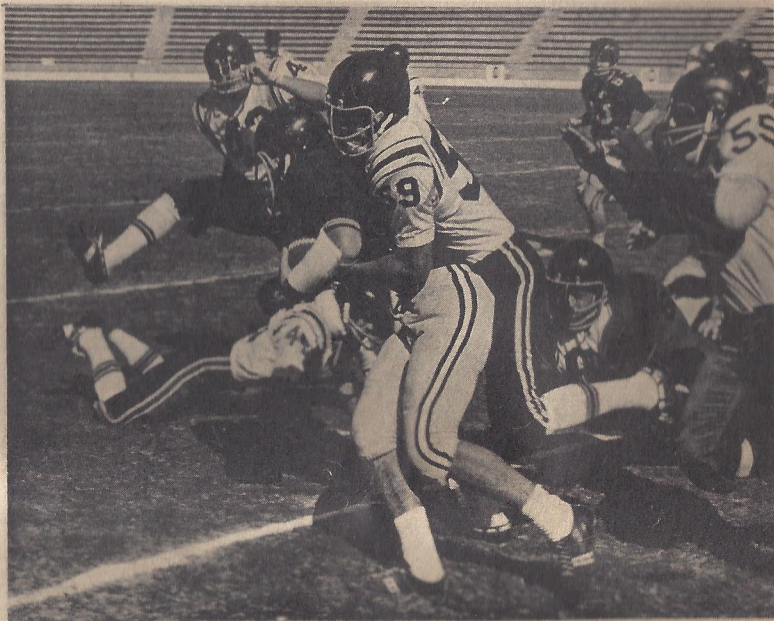
Footballers Boot Selves to Success

Dale Curtis set a new school record in booting five field goals in the 22-6 win over Whittier College last week in Balboa Stadium.

It would have been a 6-6 tie without Curtis as he also kicked the extra point on the touchdown play. The only other scoring was an eight yard pass play from Wayne Clark to John Defries for six points.

The defense did an excellent job in stopping the Poet running game. In the first half they held them to a total of three yards. During that same first half, Whittier pushed for only four first downs and never crossed the scoring line.

Westerner back Mike Bielman outgained the entire Whittier ground offense with 109 yards in 27 carries. His off-tackle running enabled CWU to establish a ball control offense. Bill Nugent added 40 yards in 15 carries to his total.
