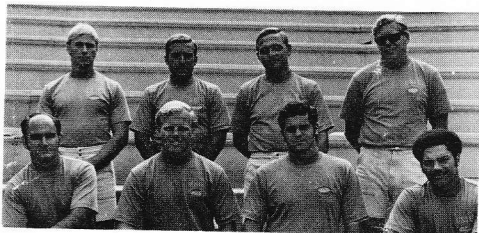


U. OF PUGET SOUND vs. U.S. INTERNATIONAL U.

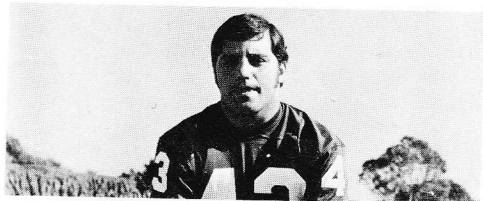
Something has to give this afternoon when the Westerners of Coach Marv Braden take on Coach Bob Ryan's Loggers from Tacoma, Wash. Both teams go into the game with identical 4-3 season records and the two rivals each hold one victory in the two game series that started in 1967.

Last year at Tacoma the Loggers grabbed a 28-14 win, while the USIU victory was by a 27-6 score in 1967.

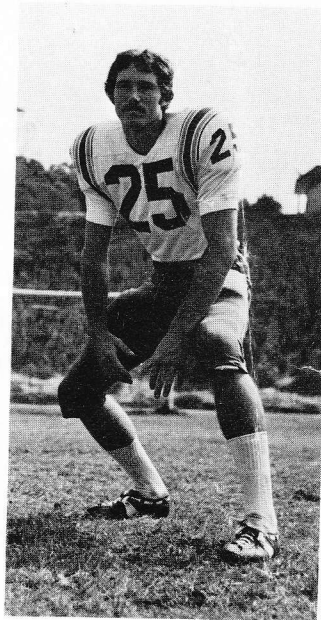
All indications point to a tight ball game today. Each holds a win over Redlands as the only common foe. The Loggers have defeated Redlands, 30-0, Pacific Lutheran, 24-7, Western Washington, 34-14, and Whitworth, 33-19. The last three victories were consecutive. Losses were to Santa Clara, 40-15, Portland State, 21-9, and Sacramento State, 27-6. USIU has topped San Francisco State, 33-14, Chico State, 3-0, Redlands, 27-7, and U. of California at Riverside, 30-16. Defeats were at the hands of Hawaii, 14-13, Whittier, 15-14 and Cal Lutheran, 9-3.



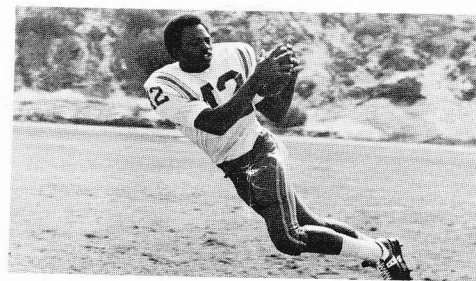
