CAL WESTERN

The University is located on 140 acres of wooded land providing an unsurpassed view of the Pacific Ocean, in the Point Loma section of San Diego.

It has the advantage of a quiet, natural setting of seclusion and beauty, and yet is but a 15-minute drive from the center of metropolitan San Diego for the convenience of some 2,200 students.

With Los Angeles to the north, Mexico to the south, the mountains and desert to the east and Pacific Ocean to the west, California Western University is an outstanding educational institution in the center of an area affording diverse activities.

At California Western, campus life is viewed as an integral part of the University and the educational process. The emphasis is upon wholesome living, with the kind of atmosphere that one would expect in a good home.

Student activities, so much a part of campus life, are as varied as the interests of the young adults who comprise a college community. They run the gamut from intercollegiate debates to dances, from a model United Nations to service clubs and athletic events. There are no sororities or fraternities.

California Western University provides the student with many educational, cultural and recreational opportunities to be found only in a cosmopolitan area — the art centers, museums, theatre groups, Palomar Observatory, Starlight Opera, San Diego Symphony Orchestra, concerts, forums, outstanding speakers and major fine arts productions.

CAL POLY

California State Polytechnic College is one of the 17 California State Colleges. The campus is located midway between San Francisco and Los Angeles at the foot of the Santa Lucia Mountain Range, 12 miles from the Pacific Ocean. The campus is a sprawling, growing community consisting of some 2,850 acres and boasts an enrollment that should top 7,500 men and women this fall.

Cal Poly is fully approved by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools and the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. It offers the Bachelor of Science degree in agriculture, engineering, applied arts and applied sciences; the Bachelor of Education; the Bachelor of Vocational Education; and Master of Arts in Education.

The College was established in 1901 by the California Legislature. It opened as a state vocational high school and was the forerunner of vocational education in agriculture and industry in California. The level of instruction was raised in 1927 to that of a junior college, and in 1933 it was changed to a two and three-year technical college. In 1940 the State Board of Education authorized Cal Poly to grant the BS degree for completion of the four-year curriculum.

Since 1949, the college has granted the Master of Arts in Education Degree.

Cal Poly has gained not only national, but world-wide recognition for its practical "learn-by-doing" approach to college education. Its students first receive emphasis in the practical phases of their major field, and related arts and sciences are introduced as the student progresses.

Ozzie's Marching Charger Band performs during the first half of half-time.

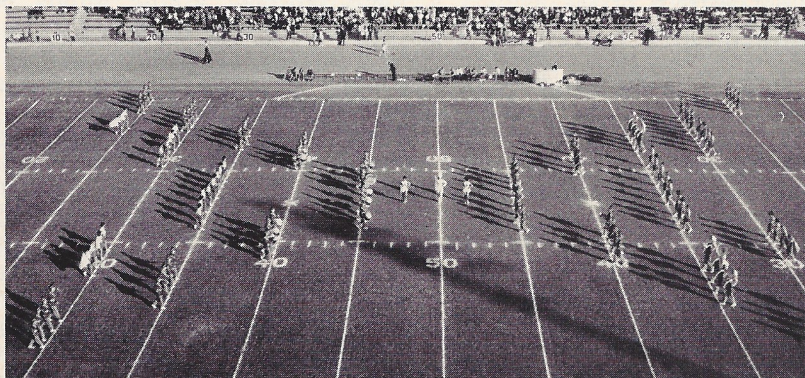
This band under the direction of Bart Hazlett is truly one of the best in the area. They performed their 38th half-time performance during the Chargers to San Diego in 1961.

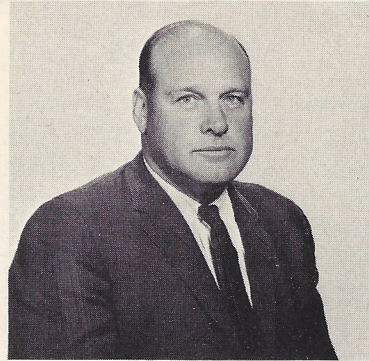

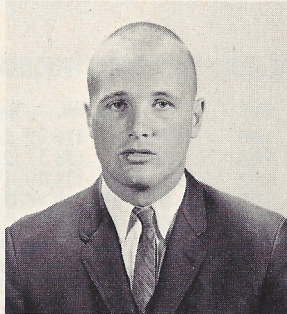

a 180-pound junior fullback who ended last season carrying the principal load of the Mustang running attack ... gained 343 yards in 90 carries to lead team in rushing.



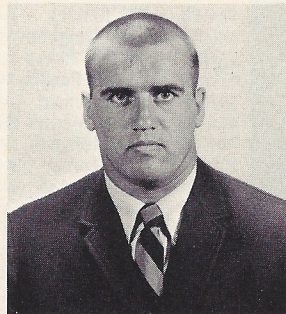

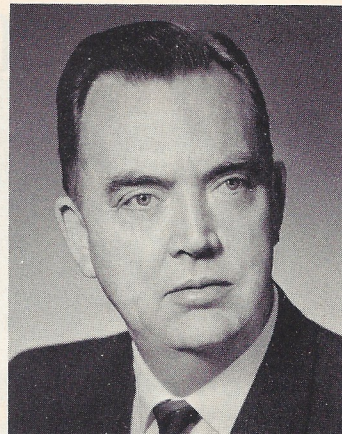
New head varsity football coach is Robert Dinaberg, a UCLA graduate of the Bruin glory days of the late, great Henry (Red) Sanders.

He was a guard and tackle on the Sanders-coached Bruin teams of 1956-57 and was graduate assistant in '58 to Coaches George Dickerson and Billy Barnes. He was also a standout gymnast at all levels.

With a B.S. Degree in Physical Education from UCLA, Dinaberg received his M.A. degree in PE from California State College at Fresno Sept. 1.

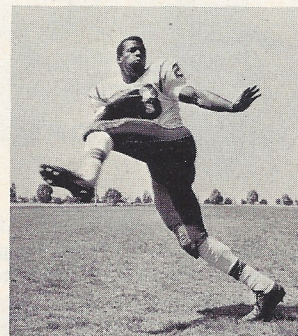
