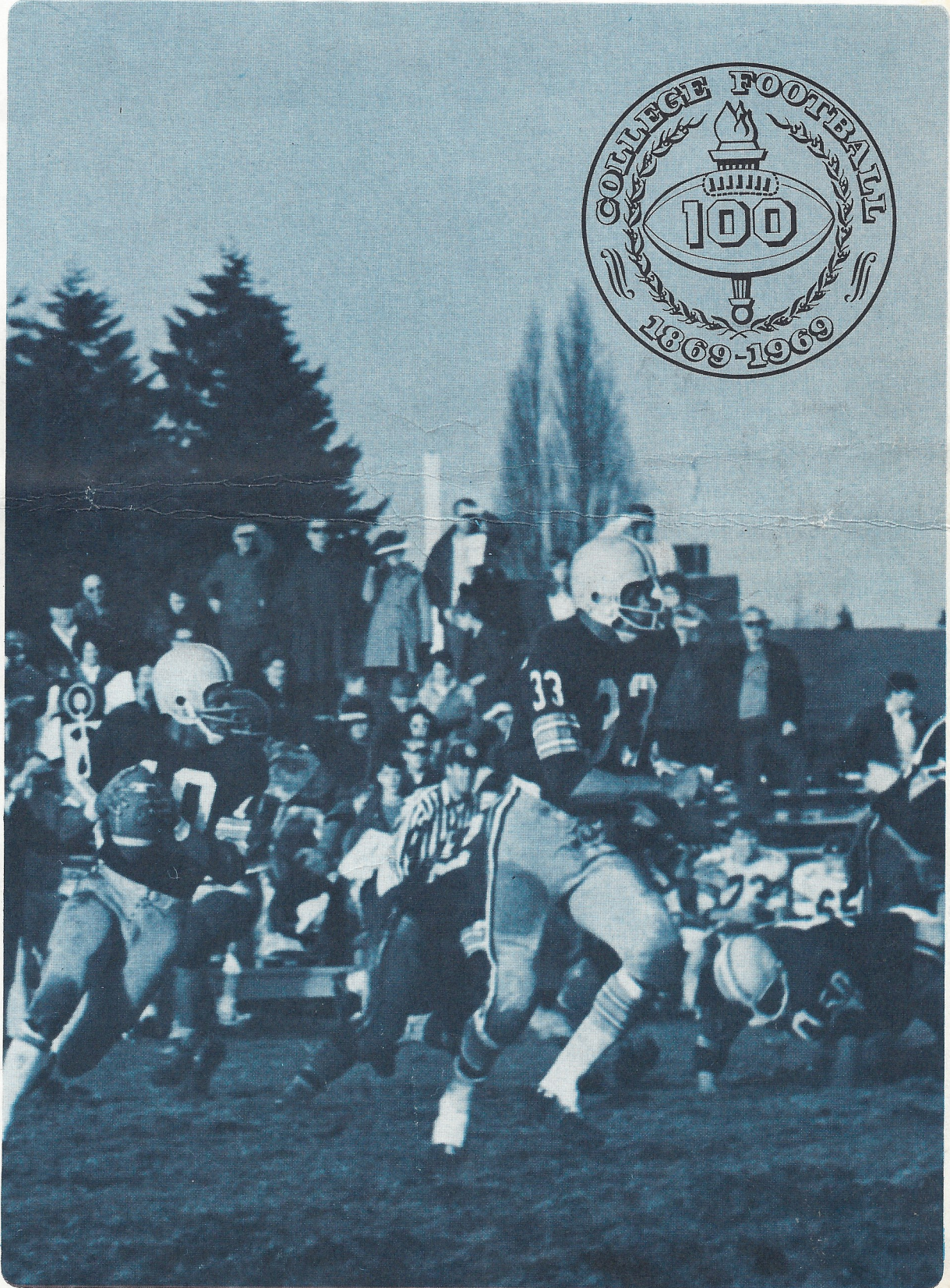
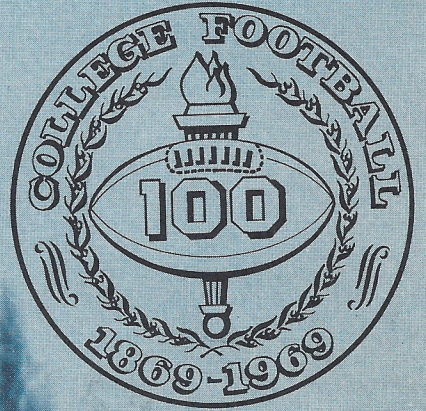

Last week in Pomona may have provided Puget Sound fans with a tipoff for the games to come. Look for every team the Loggers play to be "inspired" by the attention given UPS by Sports Illustrated . . . that two-fold quarterback act continues. Bob Cason's 62-yard run at Pomona was followed by an injury and Bob Botley shook previous injuries to enter the game and hit the winning pass to Gene Tomlinson . . . best pass rushers were middle guard Bob Lucey and anchor end Dennis Brennan who twice got Pomona quarterback Bill Joost for losses of 21 yards . . . Mike Long made the big defensive play, nailing halfback Rick Segerblom for a four yard loss after Segerblom caught a flat pass on a 4th down and "five to go" situation in the final two minutes at the UPS 33 yard line . . . Scott's attempt to kick a record-breaking 53-yard field goal was foiled when the Sagehen line blocked the try . . . interested onlookers at the game included the entire Cal Western coaching staff . . . better get your tickets now for next week's Hawaii game. The good seats undercover are going fast and it looks like a sellout for Cheney Stadium. 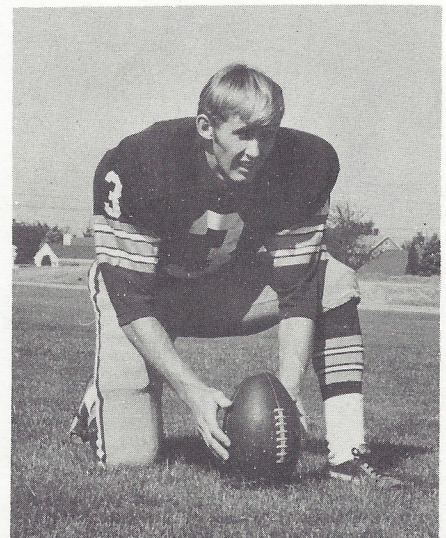

**Strong on Sports . . .**

Clint Scott's magic toe provided the margin of victory last week in the final minutes of a wild game at Pomona. The Loggers' 146-pound kicking star booted the winning extra point in addition to a 42-yard field goal which figured prominently in a 10-0 Logger lead. Booting points is nothing new for Scott who now has kicked 79 of them in a UPS uniform and his 42-yard field goal was three-pointer number 18 at UPS. Scott twice has booted 42-yard field goals in the past, against Hawaii last year and against Whitworth in 1966. A look at Logger records reveals (see records pages 4 and 5) Scott's name in 18 places but the most prominent must be his position as the highest-scoring player in UPS history with 133 career points. Scott began kicking soccer-style in his junior year at Newport high school in Bellevue. As a senior he set a Kingco League record for placekicking and was given special recognition to the all-star team. He had come to Bellevue two years earlier from Boksburg, South Africa where he played soccer and competed in track. The Logger kicker rates high with us at the Goofy Goose, too. Stop by where Clint and his Logger mates enjoy their hamburgers and shakes — at Dave Strong's Goofy Goose Drive In, 3702 Sixth Avenue. We're just around the corner from Baker Stadium.

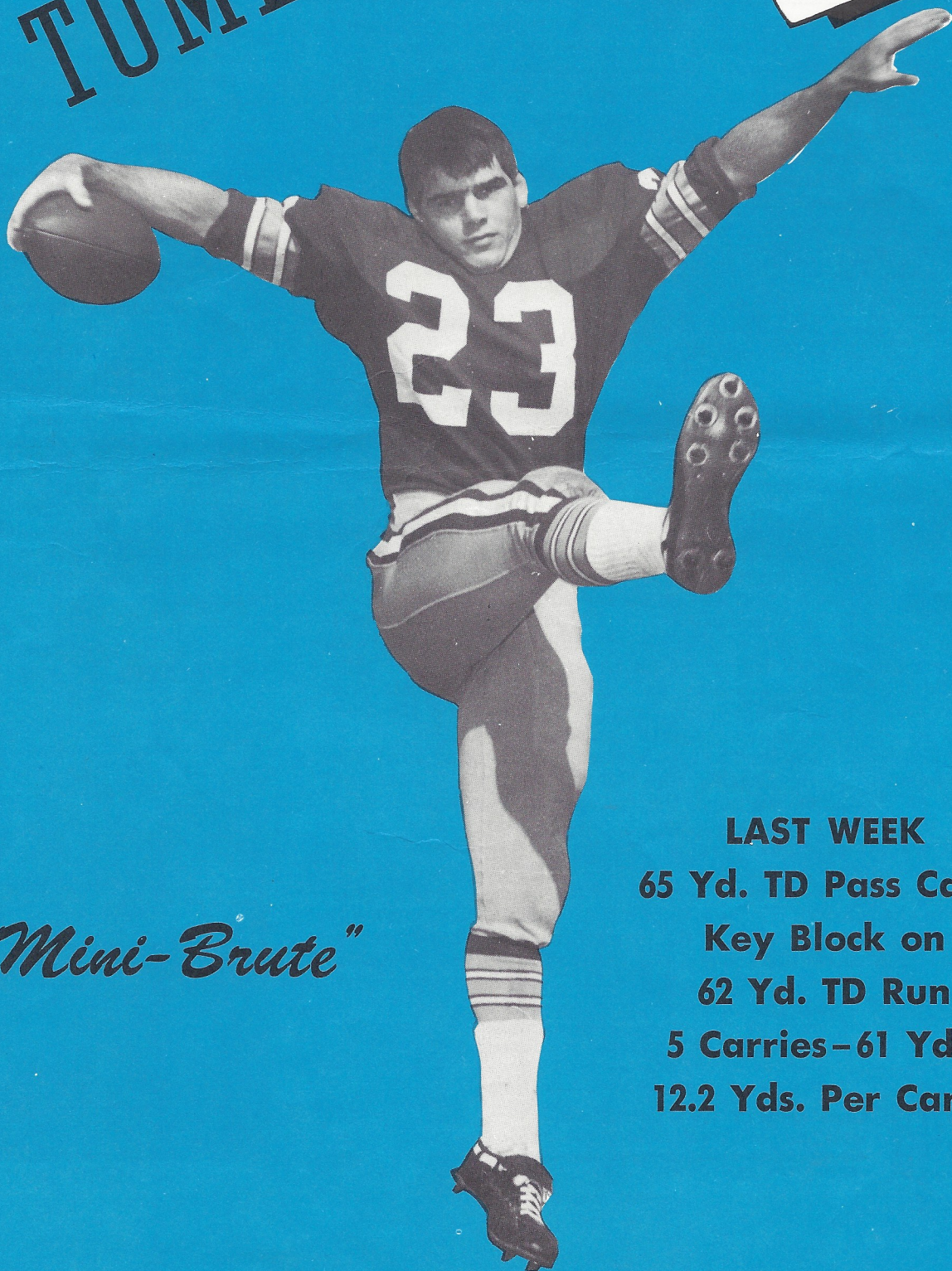

## Today's Game

### CAL WESTERN OR USIU?

The recent renaming of California Western University to United States International University hasn't confused the University of Puget Sound football team a bit. The Loggers know that today's opponent is the same Cal Western they remember from the 1967 season . . . when the Westerners bashed Puget Sound 27-6 in San Diego's Balboa Stadium.

A new coach, Marv Braden, has taken over the USIU team, but one familiar face remains and the Loggers still have nightmares about Wayne Clark, whose passing as a sophomore two seasons ago destroyed UPS hopes. Clark tossed for 122 yards and two touchdowns, completing 11 of 25, and sneaked across for a third score in that well remembered contest.

"Now they've got a quarterback who starts ahead of Clark," UPS coach Bob Ryan laments, "we're really in trouble." Ryan's reference is to Bill Miller, out much of last season with a broken leg, who scored twice in directing the USIU win over Simon Fraser.

Both teams had to fight off fourth quarter drives to claim victories last week. The Loggers lost a 10-0 lead to Pomona and then erased a 16-10 Pomona advantage in the final minutes at Claremont, Calif.

The Westerners staged a goal-line defense to spill Simon Fraser 34-28 in a wild affair at San Diego.

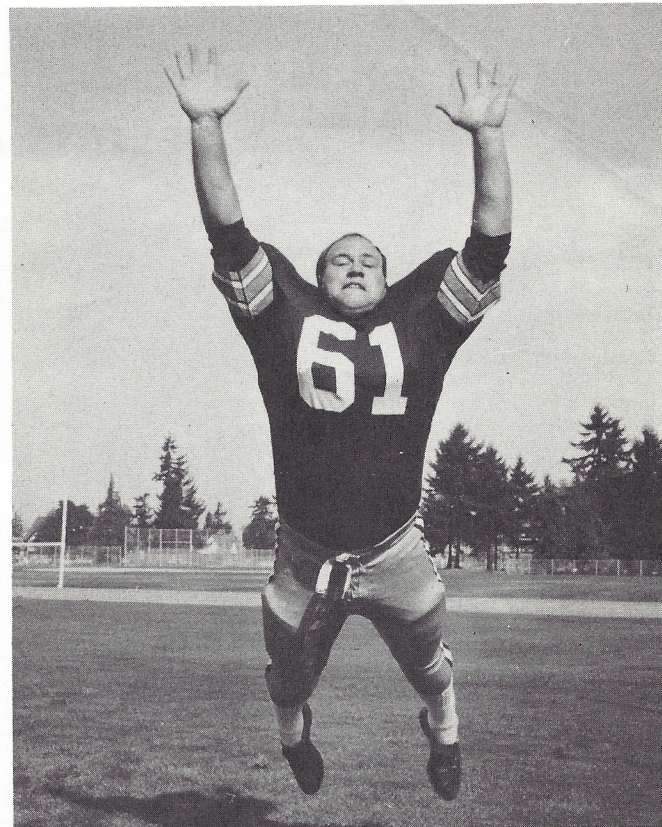

### **POMONA READS SI; LOGGERS DO TOO!**

Sports Illustrated's story about the UPS Loggers being one of the top five college division teams in the country found a prominent position on the Pomona College bulletin board last week. And the Sagehens flew at the Puget Sounders with every ounce of fury before Bob Botley hit Gene Tomlinson with a 65-yard touchdown pass for a 17-16 Logger victory in the final minutes in Southern California.

Clint Scott calmly booted the winning point with 5:40 left on the scoreboard and the UPS team averted disaster in its bid for national recognition by sneaking through the season opener. Perhaps the Loggers were guilty of believing their own press clippings!

UPS dominated the game completely through three quarters, holding a 10-0 lead and never being genuinely threatened. Pomona accounted for only two first downs before intermission and a minus three yards rushing in the third quarter. The Hens did connect on five of seven passes for 61 yards in the third period but the Loggers hardly allowed them across midfield.

Bob Cason, meantime, scampered 62 yards for a tally in his own patented, scrambling manner and Scott booted a 42-yard field goal clear out of the Stadium into some trees behind the fence.

Then Pomona stormed back. A leaky pass defense cost the Loggers yard after yard and quarterback Bill Joost passed for 120 yards in the final period to give his team the lead at 16-10.

Botley, Tomlinson, and Scott were there to change all that. Whew!

### **ALOHA, ARNOLD AND AHU!**

Next week when the University of Hawaii says aloha to Tacoma in the big Centennial Game at Cheney Stadium, look for Arnold and Ahu along with an awesome array of talent.

The Loggers will not forget Arnold. He is the same Larry Arnold who connected on 23 of 33 passes for 227 yards against UPS in Honolulu Stadium before 15,440 fans who called the game the "most entertaining ever played in Hawaii." The Rainbows scored twice in the final 90 seconds to turn back a determined UPS team 38-28.

Ahu is a shifty tailback named Bobby, up from Hawaii's freshman team and figured to be a future star for coach Dave Holmes and his team. He is aligned in the backfield with Bill Massey, a plunging fullback who gained 76 yards against California's Golden Bears last year in Hawaii's near-upset (a 17-12 loss) to one of the stronger PAC-8 teams.

Hawaii tied New Mexico Highlands 16-16 last week in Honolulu and New Mexico Highlands was rated the nation's fourth best college division team last year. It looks like a rugged battle ahead.

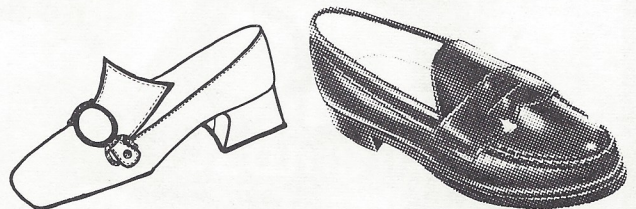

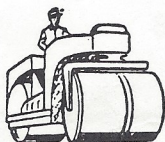
